Application Guidelines

Purpose of the program:

Zone B7-P8 is an AiR program founded in 2013 in Mizpe Ramon, a local council in the Negev Desert, South of Israel. The program is intentionally located in the midst of the desert and its marked goals are:

- 1. To provide artists with the time, resources, facilities and working space to deepen their individual artistic research, as well as to engage in networking and collaborate with other artists;
- 2. To use the desert as a source of inspiration for art that advances sustainability and uses the available materials sand, rock, wind, heat; explores the highly-relevant and interesting combination of art, technology and sciences; refers to the peripheral settings as an opportunity to re-examine ideas and develop new perspectives;
- 3. To bring contemporary art in the making to the geographical and social periphery;

What we offer:

Duration of residencies: 5 to 12 weeks

<u>Number of participating artists:</u> 1-4 at a time <u>Application Deadline:</u> ongoing/apply any time

Studio Information:

220 sq .m. shared studio space with a 100 sq. m garden; light working tools; WiFI internet;

Accommodation Information:

Mattress in a shared sleeping hall; Separated space is optional; Other solutions are available based on needs;

Other services:

Promotion; coordination and relations with local partners/community;

Costs:

€20 per day. All other expenses are not included.

- Please note that responsibility for insurance (property, health, life, etc.) are on the artists/scientists. In addition, responsibility for travel visa to enter Israel for those who need it is on the artists/scientist only.
- Successful participating artists/scientists will be provided with a signed certificate letter of participating for use in applying independently for grants, border control or visa.

Application requirements:

Applicants must be active contemporary visual artists, multi-media artists, or scientists from any country.

Application proposal should include artistic or scientific research regarding part/all the following subjects: Desert, Sciences, Technology, Sustainability, Community.

Requirements from visiting artists/scientists:

We put great emphasis on the artistic process itself - therefore we are not product-oriented, but rather encourage research, reflection and experimentation with no obligation or pressure to produce physical and final body of work.

However, we expect our visiting artists/scientists to:

- Be open to collaboration with local parties and community;
- Document the work process;
- Write a log or blog about their stay;
- Allow open-studio visits;
- Give at least one workshop* on a topic of their expertise**;

*We might charge workshop participants an entrance fee. In that case, all income will be channeled to Zone B7-P8's funding. If the workshop is successful and you give more than one during your stay, income will be split.

**For experienced artists we wish to create the opportunity to give workshops or classes in known universities or academies throughout Israel - in such case, all income will go to the artist. If you think you have the necessary professional experience, do send us a proposal and we will try to arrange it.

The application must include:

- Complete application form (pdf format)
- Up to 20 images that best portray your work (jpeg format, 72 DPI, up to 1024pxl@width)
- CV including artistic exhibitions, residencies, grants, etc. (pdf format)

Screening and Notification

The candidates will be screened by the program's professional team.

The artists/scientists selected will be informed within 1-2 months from submitting full application (and receiving confirmation it was received by us).
